

ROY PETER BACH MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Four annual scholarships of up to \$3,000 will be awarded each year (half per each semester) to a Pawnee County graduating senior who resides in Pawnee County.

Scholarships are renewable for the second additional year, if recipient reapplies and is selected a second time. Scholarships are not granted more than two years in a row to the same applicant.

Screening committee will consist of the Bach Scholarship Foundation members.

Applications and attached documents must be **completed and filed by _____, 20__**. Final decisions on scholarships will be made by the Foundation Board of Directors by May 1st.

Eligibility—

Applicants must be a current senior residing in Pawnee County and enrolled at a Pawnee County high school (Larned High School or Pawnee Heights High School) who has been accepted or anticipates being accepted into an accredited four-year university, two-year junior college, vocational college, or vocational training program. Preference will be given to vocational fields of study, including agricultural, automotive and diesel mechanics, electrical, health fields, etc.

Applicant must possess a cumulative G.P.A. of at least a "C" or higher at time of application.

The Scholarship is available for tuition, room, board, and books. Funds will be paid directly to the school upon proof of enrollment. If any monies remain, it can be applied to the next semester. If no semesters remain, the school may write check of remaining funds to the student.

To Apply--

1. The application must include a **Cover Page** containing the following information, double-spaced, in the following order:
 - a. Applicant's full name (nickname in parentheses)
 - b. Applicant's home address
 - c. Applicant's phone number and email address
 - d. Names of college(s) or school(s) preferred and whether the applicant has already accepted for next fall.
 - e. Applicant's photo
 - f. Parents' name

(See attached papers. Any missing information voids your application for this scholarship.)
2. A **one-page essay** stating applicant's college and career goals (i.e. what field of study one is pursuing, what college/institution one will be attending, how long it will take

to become licensed/certified/get bachelors or master's degree, one's five-year plan).
Essay must be type-written, double-spaced, on a single page.

3. **Three references, including phone numbers.** These should be adults such as the applicant's (1) high school principal, (2) a teacher or guidance counselor, and (3) a trusted adult who is NOT a relative. No letters are required to be written by the references.
4. **A copy of applicant's high school transcript.**
5. **A list of extracurricular or community service activities.** A concise list of honors, awards, activities, and achievements. Do not send excessive documentation. Examples of activities include school, 4-H, Boy Scouts, sports, etc.

NOTE: Your application for the Roy Peter Bach Memorial Scholarship will NOT be accepted if any blank is not completed.

Have you saved any money for an education beyond high school?

Do you plan to work part time during your education beyond high school?

List the part time employment you have had since 9th Grade to the present:

References: List three names and addresses and phone numbers (if you know) of adult persons who can attest to your eligibility for this scholarship, people such as counselors, teachers, principals, pastor, businessmen and women you know, trusted adults, former employers, etc. Do not list relatives. Do not tell them they have to write letters of recommendation. Just list the three names and the information:

PERSONAL: Write in your own handwriting, or type, a short essay no more than one page stating why you are applying for this scholarship. Describe your career goals and what you want to do with your higher or vocational education?
